I have been an active member of the Lomond Association since winter 2007 when we held a series of meetings to shape the Lomond Association's Vision 2012. At that time I participated in the Steering Committee and was asked to serve as co-chair of the Steering Committee in summer 2007. I was elected President in October 2007. I maintain regular communication with committee chairs and delegate tasks as needed to keep all parts of the Association working together and not duplicating efforts. Finally, I see my role as that of a vocal advocate for the neighborhood and the organization at all levels: around the neighborhood, across Shaker when interacting with fellow association presidents, city organizations, and city government officials, and occasionally outside Shaker when responding to the media.

If elected as President for a second term, I would focus my energy primarily on membership and marketing. Now that there is already momentum and several projects underway, I would like to broaden our base of support by getting more Lomonders involved in the Association. I believe

that we can make better use of our publications and graphics arts experts to develop some outstanding marketing materials for distribution to prospective buyers and renters as well as new neighbors to highlight the many strengths of our neighborhood.
